## KEY ISSUES IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF CLARK COUNTY

Each subcommittee needs to identify issues within their respective field and report on them at the February steering committee. You will be given 5 minutes to make your committee's report. Afterward, the entire steering committee will identify key issue overall and we will use a nominal group process to identify priorities.

Issues are to be thought of as problems to be solved, concerns or needs to be addressed, or opportunities to be pursued. Issues should be stated clearly as problems, concerns, needs, or opportunities. For example, "education" of itself is not a problem or concern; "a high percentage of high school graduates are illiterate and lack basic skills" is a problem.

You can begin the meeting by passing out this sheet and asking each of the members to list what they consider their priority issues within the committee's field of expertise. On a flipchart, list one issue from each of the group members. Open the floor to an overall discussion so members can get a better understanding of the issues. Ask if any critical issues have not been listed. When discussion is complete, ask the group to determine whether each listed issue is a high, medium or low priority. You can use a show of hands or another type of informal voting method. Note the High priority issues and bring this list to the February steering committee meeting.
